#### **Professional Education Requirements**

Post Baccalaureates may choose to take the Graduate equivalency to the undergraduate courses required for certification; graduate equivalencies will apply both towards certification and masters' degree. Ex. EDUC 200 = EDUC 542; 542 will meet certification requirement and apply towards MAT degree. Equivalent courses are in "Grad Equivalent" column. Note: not all certification courses have graduate equivalencies.

#### **Retention Criteria:**

- Complete at least 6 hours of professional education each year
- Complete Field Experiences and receive favorable evaluations from cooperating teachers and faculty supervisors
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above after acceptance to the program
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above in professional education courses and content area courses

#### Other requirements that must be completed prior to certification:

- Successful completion/passing of appropriate Content Area Assessment
- Successful completion of program certification portfolio (EDUC 400) and exit interview

#### **Other Requirements:**

Post Baccalaureate certification students completing the 2017-2018 FAFSA to receive financial aid for certification must complete the following questions on the FAFSA accordingly:

Question #29 – What will your grade level be? – Student must answer "5th year/other undergraduate."

Question #30 – What degree or certificate? – Student must answer "Teaching Credential (non-degree Program)."

<u>Question #48</u> – Are you a masters or doctorate student? - **Student must answer "No-Not working on a masters/doctorate program."** 

#### Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) degree

If you are planning to pursue the MAT degree after certification you will need to relay that information to your Education advisor since that may determine how many certification courses you should take at the graduate level. (In some cases, taking all of the graduate options would result in your taking more than the 36 hours needed for the degree.) The MAT degree requires a total of 36 hours of EDUC coursework at the graduate level which includes 9 hours of core courses (EDUC 500, 504, and 508).

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
