#### Retention Criteria:

- Complete at least 6 hours of professional education each year
- Complete Field Experiences and receive favorable evaluations from cooperating teachers and college supervisors
- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above in professional education courses and GPA of 2.5 or above in content area courses

#### Other requirements that must be completed prior to certification:

- Successful completion/passing of appropriate Content Area Assessment – MoCA
- Successful completion of program certification performance assessment – MEES

#### Other Requirements:

Post-Baccalaureate certification students completing the FAFSA to receive financial aid for certification must complete the following questions on the 2025-26 FAFSA accordingly:

Section 4 – Student College or Career School Plans:

- “When the student begins the 2025-26 school year, what will their college grade level be?” – Answer “Other undergraduate (junior year and beyond)”
- “When the student begins the 2025-26 school year, will they already have their first bachelor’s degree?” – Answer “Yes”
- “Will the student be pursuing an initial teaching certification at the elementary or secondary level?” – Answer “Yes”

#### Graduate Post-Bacc and the MAT degree

If you are planning to reapply to the college for the Graduate Post-Baccalaureate program (in order to take some of your certification courses at the graduate level), note that you may want to delay some courses until after you’re admitted to the Graduate Post-Bacc program. For example, the graduate equivalent for **SOCI 270 and EDUC 230** (EDUC 555 and EDUC 560) are core courses for the MAT (Master of Arts in Teaching) degree.
